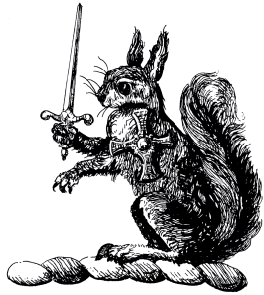
High Victorian or Fairbairn-style

Drawing modern crests in the style of the late James Fairbairn has become something of a speciality of ours. 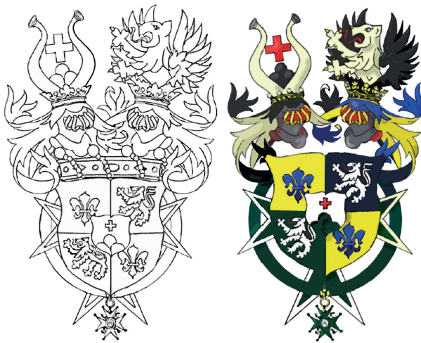

Mid-century Style

Even more popular than Fairbairn-style crests are our pared-back reinterpretations of existing arms - or the creation of new ones - inspired by mid-20th-century graphic design. This approach, pioneered by German heraldic artists, reduces arms to their essential forms. Though developed in the 1950s, its foundations lie firmly in medieval heraldry. The result is a style that feels both modern and timeless: clear, graphic, and often reproducible in a single colour, much like a logo. Originally adapted for stamps and embossers, these designs have since proven remarkably versatile, retaining clarity even at very small scales or when viewed from a distance. Although customers often prefer bookplates as stickers we cannot guarantee that the adhesive will not yellow. We advise using one of our other papers (as above) in conjunction with a non-yellowing glue stick, which can be supplied *from* €8 each. Ordinary glue will yellow over the course of a lifetime, permanently damaging every book.

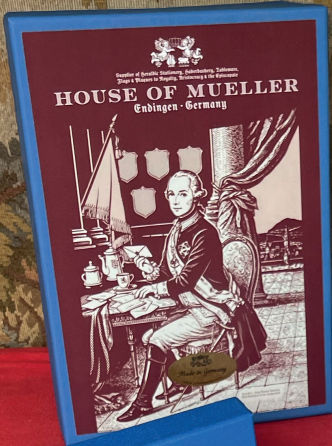

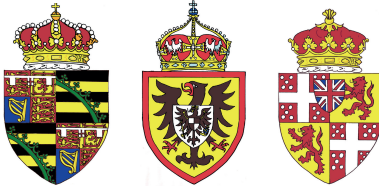
